3. Read the English meaning.
4. Change one word and make your own sentence.

1. I am ...

저는 [name/job]이에요/예요.

jeo-neun [name/job]-i-e-yo / ye-yo

I am [name/job].

Use **이에요** after a word with a final consonant. Use **예요** after no final consonant.

저는 학생이에요.

jeo-neun hak-saeng-i-e-yo

I am a student.

2. I am from ...

저는 [place]에서 왔어요.

jeo-neun [place]-e-seo wa-sseo-yo

I am from [place].

저는 미국에서 왔어요.

jeo-neun mi-guk-e-seo wa-sseo-yo

I am from the United States.

3. I like ...

[thing]을/를 좋아해요.

[thing]-eul/reul jo-a-hae-yo

I like [thing].

한국 음식을 좋아해요.

han-guk eum-sik-eul jo-a-hae-yo

I like Korean food.

4. I want to ...

[verb stem]고 싶어요.

[verb stem]-go si-peo-yo

I want to [verb].

한국어를 배우고 싶어요.

han-gug-eo-reul bae-u-go si-peo-yo

I want to learn Korean.

5. I can ...

[verb] 수 있어요.

[verb] su i-sseo-yo

I can [verb].

한국어를 조금 할 수 있어요.

han-gug-eo-reul jo-geum hal su i-sseo-yo

I can speak a little Korean.

6. Please give me ...

[thing] 주세요.

[thing] ju-se-yo

[Thing], please.

아이스 아메리카노 주세요.

a-i-seu a-me-ri-ka-no ju-se-yo

An iced Americano, please.

7. Where is ...?

[place/thing] 어디예요?

[place/thing] eo-di-ye-yo?

Where is [place/thing]?

화장실 어디예요?

hwa-jang-sil eo-di-ye-yo?

Where is the restroom?

8. How much is ...?

[thing] 얼마예요?

[thing] eol-ma-ye-yo?
How much is [thing]?

이거 얼마예요?

i-geo eol-ma-ye-yo?
How much is this?

9. I am going to ...

[place]에 가요.

[place]-e ga-yo
I am going to [place].

집에 가요.

jib-e ga-yo
I am going home.

10. Can you help me?

도와줄 수 있어요?

do-wa-jul su i-sseo-yo?
Can you help me?

저 좀 도와줄 수 있어요?

jeo jom do-wa-jul su i-sseo-yo?
Can you help me a little?
